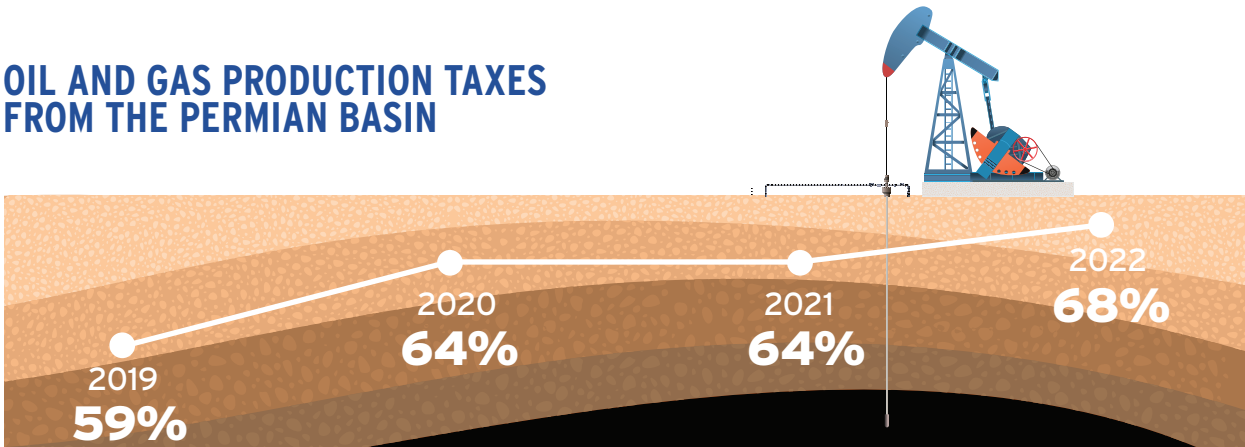
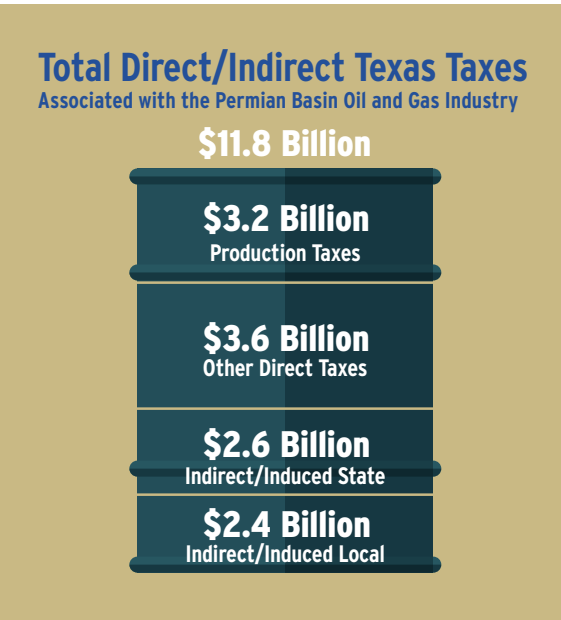
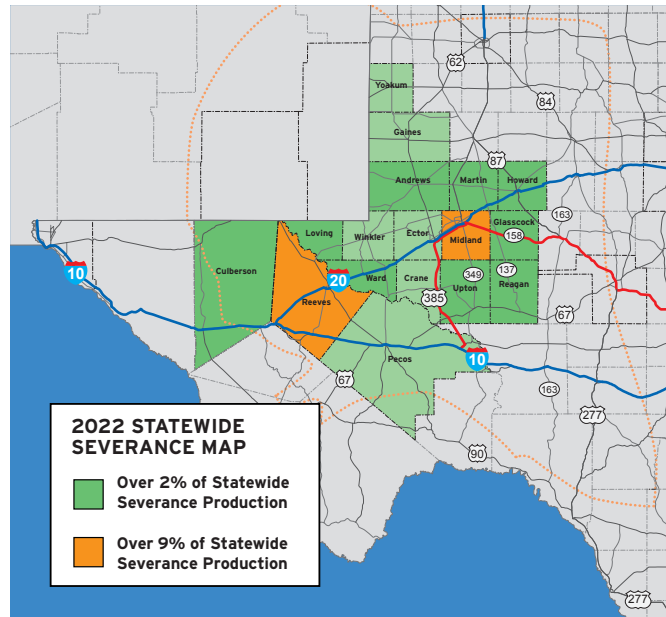



OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION TAXES FROM THE PERMIAN BASIN



Oil and gas production taxes from the Permian represented about 59% of total state severance taxes in fiscal 2019 and about 64% in fiscal 2020 and 2021 and 68% in fiscal year 2022. The Permian Basin contributed about \$979 million in royalties to the state through the Texas Permanent University Fund in fiscal 2021.

The Energy Information Administration of the US Department of Energy (EIA) projects that 2050 global demand will increase by almost 50% compared with 2020 in its baseline case. Petroleum and other liquids are expected to continue to account for the highest percentage of energy (30% in 2020 and 28% in 2050). Natural gas demand also increases notably. This baseline projection further anticipates increases in both oil and natural gas production of more than 30% over current levels.



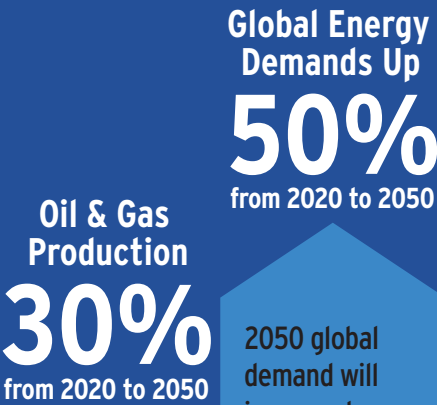
