

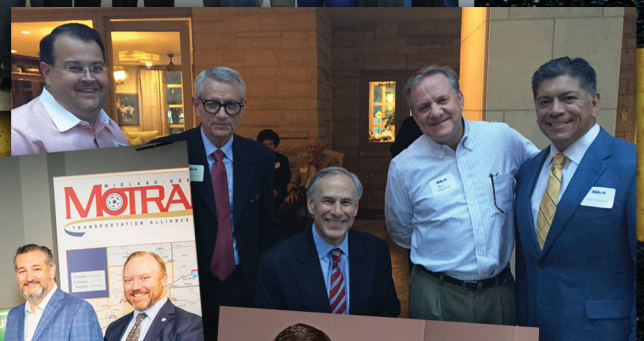

## **ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE PERMIAN BASIN**

The 2024 Unified Transportation Plan (UTP) marks the single largest investment in Permian Basin roads and highways, to date.

The 10-year transportation plan included an additional \$395 million for regional connectivity, with a \$284 million investment in US 285 between I-20 and SH 302 and another \$18 million for passing lanes on US 285 between FM 1776 and I-10. \$32.6 million was also included for continuation of efforts to add passing lanes on US 67 in Upton County. Another \$60 million in regional connectivity was included for I-20 in the Midland-Odessa area.

The plan also contained \$579 million in Commission Strategic or Commission discretionary funding for I-20 widening and improvements in Midland and Odessa.

Most notable though, is the fact that District Discretionary funds to nearly \$1.2 billion during the next decade. The additional funding was made possible during the implementation of Proposition 7, which dedicates part of severance taxes generated from oil and gas for road and highway funding.

“Tryon Lewis served as Chairman of the Transportation Commission during the implementation of Proposition and wanted to ensure that if there was a significant increase in funding generated from severance taxes, some of that was invested back in those districts where oil and gas activity is occurring,” said MOTRAN President James Beauchamp.

The District Discretionary Energy Sector Funding is unique in that projects are selected at the district level, giving more opportunity for local input. It also had a wide range of uses from added capacity to safety and maintenance projects.

“The creation of the 11E (District Discretionary-Energy Sector Funding) is paying tremendous dividends this cycle, and we applaud Chairman Bugg and the rest of the Commission for honoring this commitment to energy producing regions of the state.”

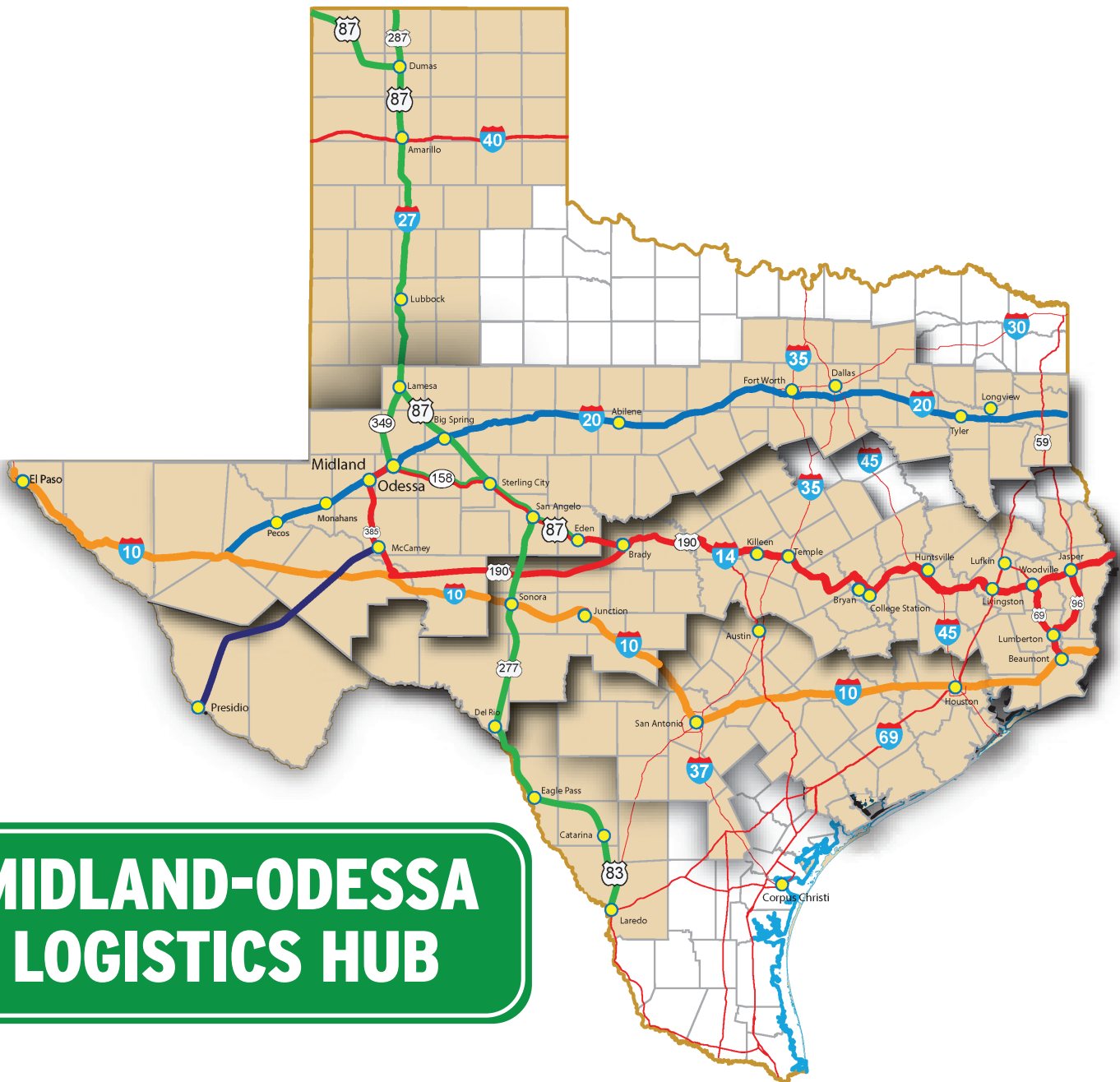

## THE MIDLAND-ODESSA TRANSPORTATION HUB

With the recent designation of I-27 through Midland-Odessa, as well as, the previous designation of I-14 and the ancillary designation of US 385 as an interstate between I-20 and I-10, the Midland-Odessa area will serve as a pivot point between 4 interstate highways.

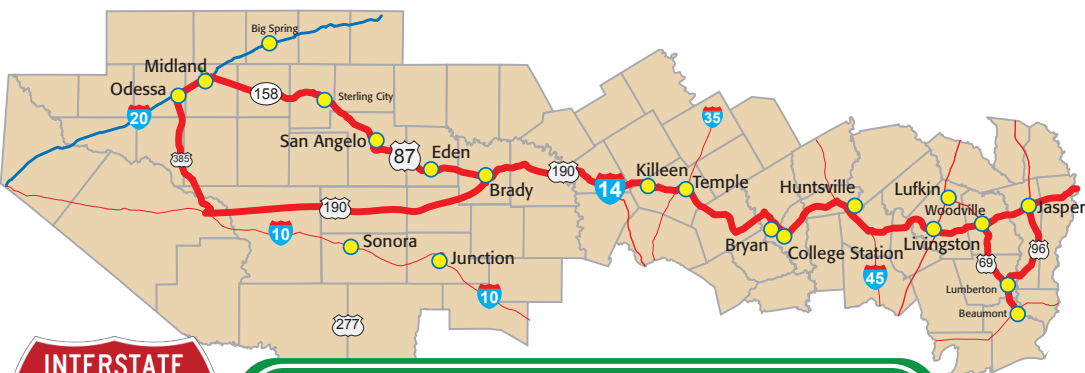
